Bringing life to science classes

Venture Grants fund incubator projects for three classes at Conestoga and Eshleman

PMEF Venture Grants recently helped bring new life to science classes at two Penn Manor schools.

Third-graders at Conestoga Elementary and second-graders at Eshleman Elementary experienced the cycle of life firsthand by hatching dozens of chicken and duck eggs placed in incubators purchased with grants totaling about \$900.

In Caroline Demangone's class at Conestoga, students began incubating chicken eggs the first week in March. She taught them what was happening inside the eggs over their 21-day incubation period.

"We had a diagram posted by the incubator so students could visualize where their egg was in the development process," said Demangone.

"Each student picked an egg from the assortment that I brought from home to be 'their egg.' This gave them a sense of ownership

"Brad is the perfect choice," Pat said. "He has a passion for PMEF and its mission, he is detailed and appreciative of our donors. He also knows the game of golf, which is important."

The Golf Scramble started in 2006, when the Foundation board was looking for a spring/summer fundraiser to supplement its annual dinner. Pat was

a golfer who had experience running similar events, so he stepped forward to lead this new venture.

In the ensuing years, the Scramble has become a popular and successful event, selling out nearly every year and raising more than \$200,000 for PMEF.

But there were some kinks to work out in that first year, when the Scramble dinner was held outdoors.

"On a very hot day, over 100 enthusiastic golfers gathered on the outside patio for an awards

dinner after the rounds were complete," recalled Frank Geist, PMEF emeritus board member. "As we all sweated together, a swarm of flies visited us from a nearby dairy farm."





Venture Grant projects for 2023-2024

Penn Manor Education Foundation provided nearly \$70,000 in funding to support 60 Venture Grants for teachers in all 10 Penn Manor schools this past year.

The grants included a wide range of projects, from \$160 to fund a chicken incubator at Eshleman Elementary School to \$7,848 to purchase small gas engines and tools for



the high school ag department curriculum.

Other grants funded a student media center at Pequea Elementary, a field trip for music students to see a Philadelphia Orchestra rehearsal, a weather station, and portable whiteboards and flip charts to support “vertical learning” at several schools.

Listed below are highlights of the

2023-2024 grants.

Penn Manor Wormery Sustainable Composting

Funds were used to purchase a worm composting system to turn cafeteria food waste into compost.

Cellos for Elementary Students

Funding was used to purchase one quarter-size and one full-size cello, to be used by fifth- and sixth-grade students at all elementary schools.



Building a Thinking Classroom

This grant paid for standing desks, tables and ottomans for a fourth-grade classroom at Conestoga Elementary.

Lancaster Science Factory Outreach

The grant funded a Lancaster Science Factory Outreach visit to Conestoga Elementary to provide STEM-based lessons.

Mindful Movement Club

This grant funded yoga mats, mindful games, coloring and journal supplies purchased by the counseling department at Penn Manor High School.

Ready, Set, Move and Learn

The grant paid for manipulatives to be used for kinesthetic activities during kindergarten classes at Eshleman Elementary.



Hambright Weather Station

Funding went to the purchase of equipment and other

materials to install a weather station monitored by students on top of Hambright Elementary as part of the school’s updated science curriculum.

Spy Museum Virtual Workshop

Funding was used to provide a problem-solving virtual workshop from the International Spy Museum in Washington, D.C. for Marticville Middle School students.



A Big Generator

This grant funded a new power generator for use by the Penn Manor Marching Unit at band performances and competitions.

Cardboard Regatta

The grant covered materials and fees for high school science students to construct boats from cardboard and float them at the Millersville University swimming pool in a competition held twice during the school year.



Horn and String Hospital, Part II

Grant funding paid for tools and materials to be used to repair musical instruments used by Penn Manor students district-wide.

Chess Club

Funds were used to purchase chessboards to establish a Chess Club for students at Martic Elementary.

Birds of Prey

This grant paid for a schoolwide assembly featuring live birds to teach Eshleman Elementary students about birds of prey.



Model UN in New York City

The grant was used to offset fees for high school Model UN Club members to attend the National Model UN Conference in New York City.

Classroom Headphones

This grant paid for a set of 64 headphones for classroom use for second-graders at Hambright Elementary.

Scene Shop Dust Collector

Funding paid for a portable dust collector and fine particle filter to keep the theatre scene shop cleaner

A Trip to the Fulton
Funding was used for a field trip for Central Manor students in grades 1 through 3 to see *Junie B. Jones* at the Fulton Opera House in Lancaster.

Food for Thought

This grant funded calculators, pencils, highlighters, snacks and other materials for the After Hours Support Program at Manor Middle School.

Keep the Math Momentum Going

Funding was used to purchase math games to replace or supplement existing materials used by sixth-grade students at Central Manor Elementary.

Animal Management and Care

The grant paid for materials to enable students to work on cats, dogs and other animals during animal science and veterinary science classes at Penn Manor High School.

Q Ball Project

The grant paid for tossable wireless microphones to be used in second- and fifth-grade classrooms at Central Manor Elementary.



Large Mouth Models

Grant funds were used to purchase mouth models to better instruct students on proper tongue placement in speech-language therapy classes at Hambright Elementary.

Physics Hooked Mass Sets

The grant enabled the high school science department to purchase hooked mass sets for labs on buoyancy, conservation of momentum, Newton's 2nd Law, and other lessons.

CPR Manikin Update

Grant funding was used to purchase replacement manikins, IED trainers and other equipment to be used for CPR training for students at the high school.

Educational Adventure

Funding paid for an outdoor creek study and invertebrate activities for Eshleman Elementary sixth-



graders.

Maximum Flavor in Minimal Time

The grant paid for air fryers, pressure cookers and slow cookers for use by students in family and consumer science classes at Penn Manor High School.

Energy Conversion Lab Materials

This grant paid for carbon dioxide and oxygen gas sensors and other lab materials for use in energy conversion labs at the high school.

Narrative-Based Problem Solving

This grant funded Lego Education SPIKE Essentials STEM kits for elementary gifted students throughout the school district.



Math Picture Books Really Work

Grant funds were used to purchase 27 math picture books and two types of vertical learning spaces for a third-grade classroom at Letort Elementary.

Middle School Problem Solving

Funding was used for transportation and admission fees for Marticville Middle students to complete the low-ropes course at Millersville University.

Hands on House Discovery to Go

This grant funded Hands-On House activities in a kindergarten classroom at Central Manor Elementary.

Instructional Reading Materials

Grant funds paid for a variety of chairs, seats, desks and benches to create a student reading nook in a second-grade classroom at Martic Elementary.

Artist in Residence

The grant paid the fees for a retired band director/teacher to serve as artist in residence for band students at Conestoga Elementary.

Building a Thinking Classroom

Funding was used to purchase five standing desk toppers for Hambright Elementary third-graders.


As the funding chart illustrates, half of these funds supported awards to Penn Manor High School seniors through endowed and annual

scholarships. Nearly 30 percent funded Venture Grants for teachers to support innovative teaching.

The remaining 20 percent of our funding went to Strong & Healthy Grants, which support our students and families in need.

For those new to PMEF, I'd like to share a bit of our history to illustrate

how PMEF has grown over the years.

That growth enabled PMEF to assist hundreds of teachers, thousands of students and countless families in need.

The beginning

PMEF was established in 1997 after the school district received an

anonymous \$500 donation from a community member to establish a scholarship. Penn Manor could not accept such a gift, so the idea of establishing a separate, nonprofit foundation to benefit Penn Manor students was set into motion.

Initially, staff and administration were represented on the Foundation's board.

"There were definitely good people involved in those early years, like Willis Herr and Don Martin, but less than \$10,000 was raised in those formative years," recalled Frank Geist, emeritus board member.

Around 2001, Dr. Tom Gemmill took over as PMEF board president, and PM Superintendent Don Stewart was a big supporter of the Foundation.

Incubators: Grants help bring science to life at two schools

and responsibility in this project, and it was amazing seeing how invested they became in the development of their chick."

Heather Fellenbaum's class at Conestoga and Patty Detter's class at Eshleman also participated in the project.

Every few days, students "candled" their eggs to see if a chick was growing inside.

"Not all eggs ended up producing a chick, which was sad for students, but they were then able to be paired with another student who did have a viable egg," Demangone said.

The class journaled about the growth inside the eggs and predicted which eggs would hatch.

They also guessed how many eggs would hatch out of the original 22 placed in the incubator. The process was repeated with duck eggs a few weeks later.

"Every day, my kids would come into the room and immediately go to the countdown calendar to see how many days were left until hatch day," Demangone said.

"We kept the chicks in the classroom for a week and a half so we could observe their behavior, create stories about them, and incorporate them into our measurement unit by measuring how

far they hopped and seeing how tall they were."

"We put this information into a line plot, and my students loved this real-life example of science and math."



Some students had eggs with fully-developed chicks inside that didn't end up hatching.

"In these moments of heartbreak, the kindness and care my students showed to their peers made me tear up on multiple occasions," Demangone said. "I was more than impressed with their maturity and generosity towards others."

In all, 12 chicks and 11 ducklings hatched at Conestoga, and eight chicks emerged from their eggs at Eshleman.

For many of her students, Demangone said, the incubation project was their favorite activity of the year.

"Thanks to PMEF, we were able to create such a meaningful experience for our students," she said.



Tom asked everyone with administration/faculty ties to step away so PMEAF could give it a shot at being an independent organization.

“The decision was made that we needed structure, working committees, and a strong mission statement,” said Geist.

These changes resulted in PMEAF raising \$100,000 and spending much of that on Venture Grants for teachers to support innovative teaching.

Pivotal moments

Key moments in the foundation’s history included reaching a million dollars in commitments for the Founding Friends program in 2006, deciding we needed an executive director, and building our treasury so we could benefit from working with an investment bank.

In 2001, founding board member Don Martin started our annual fundraising dinner, which raised over \$200,000 under his 15

years of leadership.

In 2006, the Golf Scramble started under the leadership of Pat Kline.

Don Stewart retired as Penn Manor superintendent in 2009, and took over as PMEAF executive director in 2010. He and Geist started the Leave a Legacy for Learning program in 2005, and PMEAF continues to benefit when Penn Manor supporters include PMEAF in their estate planning.

PMEAF began sponsoring an Annual Retiree Breakfast 2008, to thank our Penn Manor retirees for all they’ve done for Penn Manor schools. In return, our retirees have become very generous donors. In 2023-24, they donated \$67,000 to support PMEAF’s three funding targets.

In 2014, PMEAF participated in the ExtraGive online fundraiser, raising \$5,100. This event was crucial in 2020, when our traditional fundraising events were canceled because of the COVID pandemic. We raised over \$30,000 during the ExtraGive that year. In recent years we have

averaged over \$20,000 from donors from across the country.

New faces

Anne Kinderwater Carroll followed Don Stewart as executive director, leading the implementation of the Strong & Healthy Families program in 2016 and increasing PMEAF’s social media presence.

Superintendent Mike Leichter continued the level of support and strong working relationship that Don provided to PMEAF.

Today, we are fortunate to have PM graduate and CPA Don Mowery serve as our volunteer treasurer. PMEAF added a paid part-time bookkeeper as our finances continued to grow.

I joined the PMEAF board in 2010, after retirement, and was honored to be named executive director in 2018. Our 15-member volunteer board, all committed to supporting Penn Manor staff and students, has made my job easier.

We now partner with the Penn Manor Alumni Association to manage funds that support several PMAA

scholarships and an annual senior class project. We also reach out to our alumni to provide connections to Penn Manor through the ExtraGive and Alumni and Friends events.

Our scholarship program has doubled in the past eight years, from awarding \$60,000 to 63 seniors in 2016 to awarding over \$120,000 to 100 seniors in 2024. The recent addition of Dianne Smith as our executive assistant and Kathy Fish as our bookkeeper has helped PMEAF to operate our programs more efficiently.

PMEAF benefits from our close working relationship with PMSD administration and staff. Superintendent Phil Gale appreciates the work of PMEAF and enables staff to support PMEAF through a payroll deduction program. Penn Manor staff support our mission with an average of \$19,000 in donations each year.

PMEAF owes its success to the many community members who have stepped up to make us the strong organization that we are today.
